


Dear Parents.

Tips for Reading to Your Child

Before

- Introduce the title, author, and illustrator.
- Tell briefly what the story is about

During

- Hold the book so your child can see the words and illustrations.
- Vary your tone, volume, and pitch as you read.
- Pause occasionally to explain, comment, or look at the illustrations.

After

- Discuss the characters and what happened in the story.
- Ask questions that provoke thought.
- Help your child relate the story to something personal or to another similar story.
